Family Support Organization Telephone Protocol

The following will be recorded: State, Organization name, Caller name, Date, Start Time and End Time

Call and ask to speak to someone who can answer questions about resources for parents.

When they answer:

Introduction: Hello, my name is (caller name), and I am a parent consulting with the National Center for Hearing Assessment and Management at Utah State University as part of a research study. I am contacting you today as part of this study to ask you about the resources and information you share with families who have concerns about their child's hearing or who are in need of assistance. This should take between 15 and 30 minutes.

Do you have time to talk right now?

(*if no*) Is there someone else at [name of organization] who might be willing to participate?

(If not now, need to ask superior, etc.)

Thank you. Can we set up a time now to follow up? If not, my phone number is [number]. You can call me and I'll call you back to follow up in [less than one week].

(if yes) Thank you. The information you provide will help us understand the important role family organizations such as yours play in supporting families. We will share the overall findings with you to help you understand the strengths and challenges family organizations face in helping families to guide your own program goals. We will not share anything specific about your organization.

There is minimal risk involved. No information about your specific organization will be reported; instead, information across all states will be summarized. Your individual name will be replaced with an ID number that is linked with your answers. You may decline answering any questions that you do not want to answer. You also can ask me to call you back if this is not a good time or you may refer me to someone else in your program.

Do you agree to participate?

(if yes) Thank you, I'll get started with the questions. (if no) Thank you for your time. Is there someone else at [name of organization] who might be willing to participate? (If yes, but not now, need to ask superior, etc.) Thank you. Can we set up a time now to follow up? If not, my cell number is [number]. You can call me and I'll call you back to follow up in [less than one week]. (If they need more information before agreeing to participate.) I will have the study team at Utah State University contact you to provide additional information.

Can I please record your **name and contact information** in case I need to follow up?

Interview Protocol: I am going to provide seven scenarios to you and would like you to respond how you would to any parent calling and asking the questions in the scenario. I understand that your conversations with a family calling in would be much more personalized and include more details. It is okay to just list for me the information and resources you would provide for a parent with that specific question.

Please keep in mind that there are no right and wrong answers to these questions. We are trying to get an idea of the resources available to families. This will help us find out if there is a need for additional resources that we can develop that will better help **you** to help families. I also know that your responses to these questions may include repeat information so please feel free to tell me that you would repeat previous information. There is no need to describe a resource to me more than once.

If you would typically send families something by email or mail, would you please send that information to me. [provide addresses if needed]

Let's get started.
