

PDSA Cycle #1: Targeted Technical Assistance




Plan: Provide technical assistance (TA) to 20 facilities identified due to low reporting completeness

Do: TA was provided to hospitals by EHDI staff in the form of phone calls to NBHS Managers for November and December of 2013

Study: 4 of 20 hospitals were able sustain improvement

Act: As a result of unsustainable improvement it was decided an adapted approach was needed. A Learning Collaborative approach to Quality Improvement will be tested in 2015 in order to encourage sustained improvement that was not seen with TA alone


Percent of Missing Hearing Screening Records





Learning Collaborative (LC) with Birthing Facilities to Reduce Loss to Follow-Up/Documentation

- Why was this strategy tested?
 - PDSA #1 taught us that TA created some short term improvement but many hospitals did not sustain it and it required a lot of State resources
 - To engage hospitals in collaborative learning in order to develop best practices to sustain complete hearing screening reporting
- What was the process for identifying the strategy?
 - Data analysis to identify the facilities missing infant screening results
 - Other expertise within department with successful track record using LC
- What is the potential for the strategy to improve LTFU/D?
 - 90%, approximately 11,000 records, of the missing screening results occur in 28 facilities


