



Do you know if your baby or toddler is learning as well as he can?

## Has your baby learned to:

**3-4 MONTHS:** pay attention to faces nearby;

hold a rattle and shake it; smile

at familiar people

**4-6 MONTHS:** roll from tummy to back and

back to tummy; pass a toy from

hand-to-hand

**6-9 MONTHS:** play peek-a-boo and pat-a-cake;

babble and laugh out loud; sit up

without help

**9-12 MONTHS:** point at something to draw your

attention toward it; pull to a stand;

wave bye-bye

**12-15 MONTHS:** take turns rolling a ball; come

when called by name; shake his

head, "No"

15-18 MONTHS: nod head to mean "Yes"; push,

pull and dump things out; try to

talk and repeat words

**18-24 MONTHS:** carry a toy while walking; follow

simple directions; say or imitate a

2 or 3 word sentence

**24-30 MONTHS:** use 3 or 4 word sentences; eat with-

out help; hold a crayon and scribble

30 MONTHS sing simple songs; walk up and AND OLDER: and down stairs; help with getting

dressed

Any child from birth to 34 months who is living in Connecticut can receive a **FREE developmental evaluation**. Anyone can make a referral, but if you are not the mom or dad, please speak with the family first. Evaluation, as well as any early intervention services for an eligible child, can be provided conveniently in your home or your child's day care.
